## CANDY CORNER

Materials Needed for one $121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Candy Corner block (2 Candy Blocks + 2 Snowball blocks):
For Candy Block A \& Candy Block B you will need four different fabrics. All should have a good contrast to each other.
Two (2) $51 / 2 \prime 2$ squares Fabric A
Two (2) $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares Fabric B
Four (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares Fabric $C$
Four (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares Fabric $D$
For Snowball Blocks: (Should be two fabrics with a good contrast to Candy Blocks A \& B)
Two $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of a background fabric
Eight (8) $21 / 2 \prime$ " squares of a contrasting Fabric E

## DIRECTIONS:

## To make Candy Block A:

1. Place a $5 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric $A$ and a $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric B, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam around all four edges of the fabric squares (Fig. 2).

2. Cut on both diagonals (red dashed lines) creating four (4) half-square triangles (Fig. 3)
3. Press toward the dark fabric and trim each half-square triangle to a $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. (Red arrows)
4. Sew the four (4) half-square triangles together creating a $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ pinwheel block. (Fig. 4)
5. With a pencil, draw a diagonal line on four (4) $21 / 2 \prime \prime$ squares of Fabric C. (Fig. 5)

6. Place a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square in each corner of Candy Block $A$ and sew on the diagonal line (dashed lines). (Fig. 6)

7. Trim $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the sewn line. (Fig. 7) Press open (toward corners) creating a $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Candy Block A. (Fig. 8)

## To make Candy Block B:

Repeat steps 1-7 to make Candy Block B, using four (4) 2" squares of Fabric D for the corners of the block. (Fig. 9) The only difference in the two blocks will be the fabric used for the corners.

## To make Snowball Block:

1. With a pencil, draw a diagonal line on four (4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabric E. (Fig. 10)
2. Place a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square on each corner of a $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background square and sew on the pencil line. (Fig. 11)
3. Trim $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the pencil line \& press toward $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ snowball square. (Fig. 12) Make two (2) Snowball squares for each Candy Corner block.

## To make a Candy Corner Block:

Assemble a Candy Block A, Candy Block B and two (2) Snowball Blocks as pictured. Press toward Snowball Blocks.


## To make a Candy Corner Quilt:

Finished Quilt Size: 42" x 54"

## You will need:

- Twelve (12) $121 / 2 \prime$ " (unfinished) Candy Corner Blocks.
- Four (4) rows of three (3) blocks per row.
- 1 yard border fabric
- Cut into eight (8) $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ Width of Fabric (WOF) strips for borders (borders will need to be pieced.)
- $1 / 2$ yard of binding fabric
- $13 / 4$ yards backing fabric
- Batting cut to size
