## CHEVRON CHIC QUILT

## How to make the half-square triangles:

1. Place a $10^{\prime \prime}$ tone on tone white or solid square and a $10^{\prime \prime}$ contrasting fabric square right sides together.
2. Sew $1 / 4$ " around the outside edge and then cut the square on both diagonals (red lines) creating four half-square triangles.
3. Trim half-square triangles to $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime}$.


## To make the Chevron Chic quilt:

If you are making the chevron rows different colors, you will need three 10 " squares of four different colors and twelve 10 " white or background squares. This quilt top has four complete chevron rows.
(If you are making the chevron rows all one color, you will need 12-10" squares (You can use different prints of the same color or all the same prints of the same color - plus $12-10^{\prime \prime}$ white squares.) This is a great pattern for a 10 " square fabric exchange.

1. Create 12 half-square triangles as pictured from each of the four print fabrics. (Figure 1)
2. Sew six of the half square triangles of one color in a row as pictured. (Figure 2)
3. Assemble the rows as follows:
a. Row 1, match the background (white) triangles
b. Row 2, match the chevron (colored) fabric triangles.
4. You can add a border or two if you like, to finish the edges.

Finished quilt size without borders is approximately $36^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{\prime \prime}$.
With $3^{\prime \prime}$ borders the size is $42^{\prime \prime} \times 54^{\prime \prime}$


## To make this quilt with borders you will need:

Chevron fabric: 3-10" squares of four different colors Background fabric: 1 yard cut into $12-10$ " squares Borders: Six (6) $31 / 21 / 2$ squares (vertical borders will be pieced.
Backing and Batting: 42" x 54" cut to size Binding: $1 / 2$ yard of binding fabric
