Crib: $38^{\prime \prime} \times 38^{\prime \prime}$
Finished Blocks: $6^{\prime \prime}$
Assorted Bright Prints and Tone-onTones
$7 / 8$ yard total for the blocks
Assorted Blue Tone-on-Tones (see Step 1)
3/4 yard total for blocks

## Blue Print

$7 / 8$ yard for setting squares and binding
Multicolor Print (see Step 1)
15/8 yards for border
Backing $1 \frac{11 / 4}{}$ yards
Batting 42" x 42"

## Assorted Bright Prints and Tone-onTones <br> foundation patches <br> Assorted Blue Tone-on-Tones foundation patches Blue Print <br> 5 strips $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 35^{\prime \prime}$ for binding 12 squares (A) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ <br> Multicolor Print <br> for the border <br> 2 strips $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 33^{\prime \prime}$ for sides (cut crosswise) <br> 2 strips $4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$ for top/bottom (cut lengthwise)

## About This Quilt

Select a variety of bright fabrics to make a sea of colorful fish.

In the photographed quilt, 2 blue tone-on-tones were alternated for the fish blocks.

The multicolor print used in the border is a directional print. If you prefer a non-directional print, you will need only $5 / 8$ yard.

2Making the Quilt Top
Make 13 paper copies each of foundation sections 1,2 and 2 reversed. Refer to the foundations for color placement.

Foundation piece each section in numerical order, pressing and trimming after each patch addition. Sew the sections together as shown to make a block. Make 13 blocks.

Sew the blocks and A's together as shown to make 3 row 1's and 2 row 2's. Sew the rows together as shown.

Sew the border side strips to the quilt and trim any extra length. Add the border top and bottom strips in the same way. Carefully remove the foundation papers.

## Z Quilting and Finishing

Layer and baste together the backing, batting and quilt top. Refer to the quilting placement diagram. Stitch the fish in the ditch. Quilt gentle waves horizontally across the quilt surface as shown.

Bind the quilt.

Pattern should measure $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ across including seam allowances.
