## Perfect Pinwheel Quilt Block

For one $121 / 2$ " unfinished Perfect Pinwheel block you will need:
One $101 / 2$ " square of background fabric
One $10 \frac{1}{2}$ " square of the pinwheel fabric

1. Place $101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ fabric squares (background/pinwheel fabrics) right sides together and pin to secure.
2. Stitch $1 / 4$ " around all edges of the square, as pictured and cut square on both diagonals creating four half-square triangles.

3. Open and press toward the dark fabric.

4. Cut each square in half, as pictured. Make sure the pinwheel fabric is on the top left corner of the half-square triangles so that the pinwheels will all be going in the same direction. Then flip the right section vertically as pictured. Sew sections together and trim to a $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square by cutting extra fabric off as pictured.

6. Lay out pinwheel blocks as pictured below and sew sections together with a $1 / 411$ seam. Add borders if you like or just layer top, batting and backing and quilt as desired.


## To make quilt pictured you will need:

12-10 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of background fabric (Approx. 1 yard)
12-10 $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of a variety of prints.
$1 / 2$ yard binding
Backing and Batting: $36^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{\prime \prime}$
