TAKING FLIGHT

The Propeller Quilt Block


This block takes five contrasting fabrics:

To make one (1) 9 ¼" unfinished block:


- 1 6 ½" square Sky Fabric
- 1-6 ½" square Propeller Fabric
- 1-2 ¼" center square (fabric with a circular pattern works well here)
- 1 2 ¼" x 9 ½" strip Fabric D (D & E must be contrasting Light-Dark fabrics which also contrast sky & propeller fabrics)
- 1 2 ¼" x 9 ½" strip contrasting Fabric E

Directions:


1. Place right sides together, one 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square of Fabric A and one 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square of Fabric B




- a. Sew a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam around the outside edges of the squares.
- b. Cut squares on both diagonals creating four half-square triangles.
- 2. Open each half-square triangle and press seams toward darker fabric. Trim squares to 4".



3. Sew the two (2) 2 ¼" x 9 ½" strips of Fabric D and Fabric E strips together.



- 4. Cut the strip sets into four (4) 2 ¼" x 4" strips sets.
- 5. Assemble the block as pictured, sewing pieces together in 3 rows and then sewing the rows together. Flip the positioning of the two 2 ¼" x 4" rectangular strip sets in alternate blocks to create Blocks A and B. Make 6 Block A and 6 Block B.



Use "sky" fabric for corner and side triangles:

- 1. To make Side Triangles: Cut three (3) 14 ¾" squares on both diagonals (you will have 2 extra)
- 2. To make corner triangles: Cut two (2) 7- 5/8" squares on one diagonal
- 3. Assemble the 18 blocks diagonally: 6 rows of blocks on point
 - a. 6 of Block A
 - b. 6 of Block B
 - c. 6-9 ¼" squares of Sky Fabric
